Elena began her career as an attorney by empowering low-income families through “know-your-rights” seminars. Later, Elena helped save 1.5 million units of affordable housing, including Mission Plaza, Hollywood West, the Hollywood Knickerbocker and Morton Gardens, all located in our community.

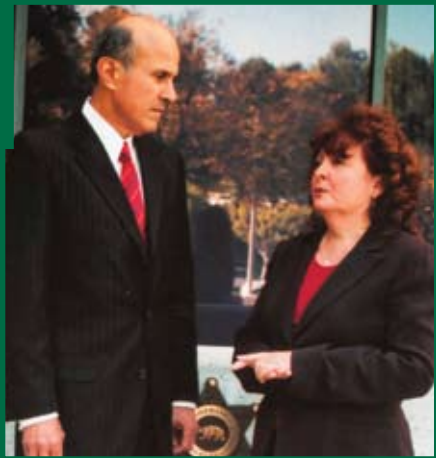

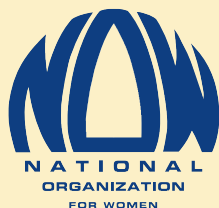
